KILDARE MINISTRIES COMBINED FAITH, LEARNING AND JUSTICE LEADERS NETWORK



2024 will continue the implementation of Kildare Ministries Living Justice Living Peace Framework. Network members will turn their attention to its integration into all of ministry life and the further development of supporting resources.

At each of these meetings guest speakers focus on emerging frameworks in teaching and school life which refresh our thinking, inspire collaboration between leadership roles, and allow time for sharing and dreaming about future strategic transformations toward Justice and Peace.

Regular opportunities will be provided for discussion around the 2024 value of 'Hope' and ways to give expression to it within the mission of each ministry.

This will also be a forum for the sharing of existing resources and collaboration on the development of new ones.

KILDARE MINISTRIES JUSTICE AND SUSTAINABILITY NETWORK

This network aims to build and strengthen a collegial network of support for those in the role of leading Justice and Integral Ecology programs in Kildare Ministries school. It will provide ongoing formation around key issues of justice and their connection to the mission of Kildare Ministries. In particular, this network will interpret the 'cry of the poor' the 'cry of the earth' as 'one cry' and a key focus of this group will be Laudato Si.

Meetings will contain both practical and theoretical elements. There will be key tasks involved with planning and leading the student seminars held collectively and also individually at Kildare Ministries schools. Additionally, staff will have an opportunity to discuss resources and programs which have worked well, as well as explore the challenges of working in this space. This group will also be provided with shared learning and planning time with the Faith and Learning Leaders in order to explore how the Values of Kildare Ministries can be given expression in their schools through an integrated approach to Justice and Sustainability.

KILDARE MINISTRIES NEW STAFF INDUCTION



The Kildare Ministries New Staff induction explores the mission and ministry of Kildare Ministries and places Jesus at the centre of all that is done in our mission. It will help develop an appreciation of how the founding stories inspire the work of Kildare Ministries today. Among the questions addressed in the induction include:

How does story help us understand who we are and why we do what we do? What part do each of us have to play in shaping and interacting with the story of Kildare Ministries?

What is my own personal and professional story, and how has that influenced and been added to by my experience of my new workplace? What have I seen or heard that has touched my heart?

How do the stories of our traditions – the Christian tradition and our founders Brigid, Nano & Daniel – inspire us in our own ministries today?

What is the Kildare Ministries story? What is its mission and vision, its history of development, its structure and governance and our roles as people working in service to that mission.

KILDARE MINISTRIES NEW LEADERS' INDUCTION

All Kildare Ministries new leaders meet with one another in their shared mission of leadership to build an understanding of leadership in a Kildare Ministries context as well as dialogue with experienced school leaders about the skills and attributes of effective leaders. Through reflection and discussion they will discern goals for individual leadership development.

Participants will also have an opportunity to explore how being a leader in a Kildare Ministries school brings expression to the vision, mission and values statement, providing a particular framework for their leadership. They will be further invited to consider how the mission of their particular ministries informs how they approach their leadership tasks.

BOARD AND STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL INDUCTION

The Kildare Ministries Board and Stewardship induction explores our mission and identity. It will help Board and Stewardship Councillors to discern how our mission informs our decision making as governors and stewards as well as understand the difference between civil and canon law.

A range of speakers will explore interpretations of 'mission' in our current realities and how this provides the lens for decision making as governors and stewards of our Ministries. It is about the centrality of mission as a driving force for decision making. Our Founders drew their inspiration, courage and energy from the primary founding person of Jesus; as Pope Francis has said: "the centre is Jesus Christ, who calls us and sends us".

Kildare Ministries draws from its traditions to become a prophetic voice for today. This day will offer a brief story of our religious orders and trace the development of forming Kildare Ministries. It will explain the role of the Trustees in terms of their canonical responsibilities and clarify the responsibilities that come with being a Director of a Board or a Member of the Stewardship Council.

BOARD AND STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL SEMINAR

Bringing together leaders of our ministries from the highest level of governance allows for carefully considered learning and reflection on key issues. Time is allowed for communal discernment on a shared Kildare Ministries response which reflects our call to leadership aligned with the Vision, Mission & Values statement.

The Board & Stewardship Council Seminar is an annual 2-day meeting involving high level input on a contemporary topic of interest, with cross-ministry dialogue.

BOARD CHAIR NETWORK

The Board Chairs Network builds and strengthens a collegial network of support for those in this key leadership role. It will provide ongoing formation around key aspects of mission leadership and develop a common approach to policies and processes across the Kildare ministries. In addition it will advance our common knowledge and understanding of mission and faith based governance

The meetings provide an opportunity for the Chairs of Boards to develop a common understanding about the way we express our faith based governance and the development of the Kildare Ministries narrative. There will be opportunity for formation through the consideration of scripture and prayer and discernment and reflection on the Kildare Ministries Vision, Mission and Values. Secondly, Chairs of Boards will have opportunities to share practises related to civil governance issues and issues pertinent to their own ministry. Importantly, these network meetings provide the Trustees an avenue to consult with and deepen the relationships with their Chairs.

KILDARE MINISTRIES STUDENT SOCIAL JUSTICE SEMINAR



Kildare Ministries runs four seminar for students in response to the Living Justice Living Peace Charter.

- to deepen understanding of contemporary justice issues and principles of Catholic Social Teaching
- to provide experiences of reflection on the Christian response to systemic causes of justice
- to enable planning for curricular and co-curricular activities
- to afford networking opportunities amongst students from Kildare Ministries schools

The Kildare Ministries First Nations Immersion at Echuca is an immersion for middle school students in First Nations culture and spirituality. Students, by taking part in walks on country lead by experienced first nations rangers, participating in forums with first nations speakers and creating artworks, will experience a deepening understanding of reconciliation and Australian history.

The Kildare Ministries Living Justice Living Peace Seminar is a two-day conference aimed at senior students active and interested in social justice and mission, providing the opportunity to learn more about contemporary issues of social justice and the call to Christian disciples to work for a more just world. Students will learn from guest speakers and join workshops to learn strategies for advocacy and activism.

The Kildare Ministries Net Zero Project is specifically for senior students with demonstrated commitment and leadership skills (Year 11) in the Ecological Justice space. Students who commit to this program must complete a full year as a member of the student-driven KM Net Zero Committee. The work of the committee commences at this event in July and continues until the end of term two in 2024.

KILDARE MINISTRIES STUDENT LEADERSHIP RETREAT

- To reflect upon the call to leadership as discipleship
- To deepen understanding around the story of Kildare Ministries and the shared mission, values and histories of the Brigidine and Presentation Sisters
- To provide age- and position-appropriate input on Mission Leadership as the foundation for their roles as student leaders in a Kildare Ministries school
- To provide input around the 'value' for the year of leadership (2024 Hope) to help foster its understanding throughout the student body
- To enable a network of support amongst the student leaders
- To continue to build the community of Kildare Ministries amongst our students and their families
- To build a network of leaders as a resource for the future; to support the Educating for Justice student seminars, as potential Stewardship Council or committee members and/or mission focussed alum.

This retreat will offer, through a range of sessions involving input, workshops and reflections, opportunities for incoming student leaders to prepare for their roles. Students will spend time unpacking the Kildare Ministries value for the year and how it provides a basis for their roles as mission leaders. Students will be encouraged to form connections with one another as a support throughout their terms of leadership.

BIENNIAL CONFERENCE

The Bi-ennial conference allows for extended input and conversation across several days, with time spent in prayer, dialogue and discernment. With representation from all ministries and all levels of governance, each conference is a unique opportunity to further the narrative and identity of Kildare Ministries. The next Kildare Ministries conference will be held in 2024 to celebrate 10 Years since the formation of Kildare Ministries.

RETREATS AND IMMERSIONS

Kildare Ministries retreats and immersions include:

- The Kildare Ministries Integral Ecology Retreat (29-31st October 2024)
- The Kildare Ministries Principals and Faith Leader's Retreat (2025)
- The Kildare Ministries Pilgrimage to Ireland (2025)

Retreats and immersions offer an opportunity for nurturing and supporting the faith journey of those within our ministries in a quiet, reflective atmosphere away from regular life.

The Kildare Ministries Integral Ecology Retreat is an invitation to staff seeking a deepening of their own ecological spirituality and sense of personal call. In particular, this network will interpret the 'cry of the poor' the 'cry of the earth' as 'one cry' for us to respond to as prophetic witnesses. The KM Integral Ecology Retreat is a retreat for staff members interested in a spirituality of the earth or staff members who would simply benefit from a spiritual retreat for any reason. No prior knowledge is required or expected. Guests of the retreat are nominated by their principals. Usually, there are spaces for two staff from each school but this may vary closer to the day.

The Principals' & Faith Leaders' Retreat fosters reflection on contemporary understandings of how faith and mission are enlivened in Catholic schools through Scripture, story, prayer and contemplation. These retreats are held across 2-3 days in quiet locations, enabling an atmosphere of relaxation and shared conviviality.

The Pilgrimage to Ireland is a 14-day journey into the deepest roots of our founding stories which underpin and inspire the mission of Kildare Ministries today. As pilgrims journey together they each contribute in a unique way to the unfolding narrative of Kildare Ministries.

Each of these experiences engages participants with the emerging spirituality of Kildare Ministries; our mission lived through our being.
